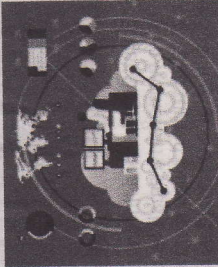


MI5 Security Service and Police.



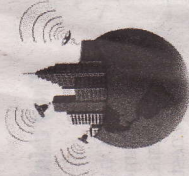
MI6 Liaison with Secret Intelligence Service and Foreign Office.

MI12 Liaison with censorships in organisations in Ministry of Information, military censorship

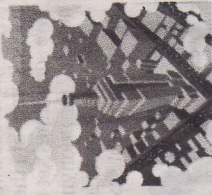
MI13 Not used (except in fiction e.g. Mi-13, The Scarifiers)
